New iMac G5 Unveiled at Apple Expo 2004 Paris

It was standing room only Tuesday, August 31, at Le Palais des Congrès in Paris as Phil Schiller kicked off Apple Expo 2004 with a rousing keynote introducing the iMac G5, which begins shipping this month. The new iMac features the high-performance G5 processor and a stunning new design that integrates the entire computer right into its 17- or 20-inch flat panel display.

It continues the iMac tradition started in 1998 with the original Bondi-blue machine by packing a complete computer system into one package. This one is a mere two inches thick. It features a gorgeous 17- or 20-inch wide screen LCD display and delivers outstanding performance with the same high-powered G5 processor that drives the high-end Power Mac G5

system. Running at either 1.6 GHz or 1.8 GHz, it has a completely redesigned system architecture (think speedy); and a high-performance NVIDIA graphics card for stunning graphics and great game play, too.

The perfect computer for iLife '04, iMac G5 lets you easily connect digital cameras, camcorders, or musical instruments for use with iPhoto, iTunes, iMovie, iDVD, and GarageBand.
